1. Regarding the possibility of a 'Human Rights Ambassador'.

We believe that in principal the appointment of a Human Rights Ambassador or Advisor would be beneficial providing that the role and the person appointed were independent to DFAT.

2. Regarding Visa Application forms.

- Visa application forms should include a question regarding any current or past involvement in organ trafficking and transplant tourism
- If a Chinese surgeon or official who has been involved in forced organ harvesting (or anyone involved in organ trafficking in any country) made a false declaration when entering Australia there would be grounds for prosecution.
- Important symbolic value and would put pressure on Australians who are sponsoring the visas eg: Westmead Symposium with Chinese transplant surgeons visiting in 2016.
- It would raise awareness around the dangers and legal implications of trafficking in organs and transplant tourism.
- It would be good to seek input from the US/Canada. What is the response? Have they had any prosecutions?
