SitRep #20 – Cat 3 – Critical Disturbance – Manus OPC – 19 February 2014 As at 1000hrs AEDST, Wednesday 19 February 2014

- The report of an unconscious transferee being found in Mike Compound in Sitrep #14 has been confirmed as false.
- Two incidents had occurred concurrently at the time, which resulted in a miscommunication of events.

SitRep #19 - Cat 3 - Critical Disturbance - Manus OPC - 19 February 2014

As at 0930hrs AEDST, Wednesday 19 February 2014 Current Situation

- It was very calm and quiet overnight, with all transferees remaining calm and compliant. This mood continues this morning.
- The Emergency Control Organisation was stood down at 0130hrs.
- The focus for today is the normalisation of services. A meeting will be held this morning to discuss the reestablishment of basic canteen services and normalisation of meal provision.
- A meeting will also be held to discuss the integration of additional Wilson Security staff arriving later today.

- While the PNG Mobile Squad is deployed away from the facility, PNG police investigators are assessing damage caused over the past 48 hours, focusing on Foxtrot and Mike Compounds.
- Transferees have expressed reservations with having PNG nationals within the facility however planning is underway to reintegrate local staff into regular operations as soon as possible to ensure these reservations are eased.
- IHMS
- · IHMS have relocated back to the clinic within the OPC. Overnight there were 5 minor presentations for cuts and bruises.
- The three transferees identified for transfer to POM are expected to be transferred on commercial flights over the next 48 hours.
- This will be the last SitRep in this chain. Further updates will be issued as new SitReps.

- The Australian Government Crisis Coordination Centre (CCC) contacted the National Office Duty Phone advising of a significant increase in reports on social media regarding further potential protest action.
- The CCC has confirmed that there is no specific information at the present time that could assist staff at the OPC in managing the current situation.
- · A process has now been established that will allow the CCC to provide any actionable information that does arise to be provided to the National Office Duty Officer for provision to the site for their consideration and actioning as appropriate.

DIBP Director, and G4S have been notified that there is no actionable information at the present time.

SitRep #16 - Cat 3 - Critical Disturbance - Manus OPC - 16 February 2014 As at 2345hrs AEDST, Tuesday 18 February 2014 Current Situation
· It is very calm all compounds. Meals are being distributed at present.
The Emergency Control Organisation remains operational.
Transferees in Oscar and Delta Compounds have agreed to not participate in a protest action over night.
Information presently available indicates some potential unrest in Foxtrot Compound however G4S advises that there is a good chance of no protest activity overnight.
The mood of Mike Compound remains heavily dependent on Foxtrot Compound.
There are currently 207 transferees residing on the oval after being moved from Mike Compound. As part of this movement, 7 agitators were identified and have been temporarily isolated in Bravo Compound for ongoing monitoring. Options for alternative accommodation arrangements for these transferees are currently being investigated.
Once the situation is stabilised, Behaviour Management Plans will be implemented for these 7 transferees with the aim of reintegrating them with the broader transferee community when appropriate
Incident Response Teams remain on standby.
· IHMS
IHMS has identified that three transferees may require transfer to POM in the next 48 hours for scanning. At the present time these transfers are appropriate for commercial flights. Further information to be provided when it becomes available.
Infrastructure
Telecommunications infrastructure was removed during the incident. Once the situation has been resolved, work will commence on re-establishing communications.

Current Situation

- \cdot The mood across the OPC is calm but heightened. The Emergency Control Organisation has been established.
- A number of transferees were moved from Mike Compound as they indicated they wanted no involvement in any potential activity. There are currently 215 transferees remaining in Mike Compound.
- · Heavy engagement has been undertaken with Oscar Compound and G4S has advised that it is confident that transferees in that compound will remain calm.
- · Foxtrot Compound remains an area of concern and there are unconfirmed reports of transferees gathering implements. The situation is continuing to be monitored.
- · Regular operations are continuing in all compounds and preparations are being made for the provision of food.
- Face-to-photo checks will be undertaken as meals are dispensed.
- · Security Presence
- There are currently three G4S Incident Response Teams on standby in Personal Protective Equipment ready for deployment if necessary, each comprising ten officers.
- A further three off-duty teams are available for deployment within 15 minutes if the need arises.
- · Arrangements are being made to isolate instigators. The PNG Police wish to discuss the matter in the morning.
- Medical
- The IHMS clinic has been relocated to a location which provides better capacity to manage further unrest should it arise. Medical staff are on standby for mass casualty response if required.
- At present, there are two transferees with IMHS with ongoing issues from last night.
- Other matters
- Transferees undergoing voluntarily return through IOM have been relocated to ensure they are able to board their airplane tomorrow.

SitRep #14 - Cat 3 - Critical Disturbance - Manus OPC - 16 February 2014

As at 1900hrs AEDST, Tuesday 18 February 2014

There is a general sense of uncertainty across all compounds and Transferees are generally subdued. Preliminary Messaging has been delivered to Transferees.

- Transferees in Mike Compound are currently agitating, seeking the name of the deceased individual. They have been advised that the name cannot be disclosed at the present time.
- At 1709 local time, G4S personnel found a transferee unconscious in Mike Compound. Further information to be provided when it becomes available.
- PNG police are on standby to provide support if necessary. Discussions are underway regarding the management of transferees involved in violent actions.
- Medical Transfers
- · All transferees requiring emergency medical treatment have been evacuated today.
- At approximately 1140hrs local time, the medivac flight carrying transferee arrived at Port Moresby en route to Brisbane. The aircraft has since departed Port Moresby and is due to arrive in Brisbane at 1800hrs local time.

SitRep#13 - Cat 3 - CRITICAL DISTURBANCE AND DEATH - MANUS OPC - 16 FEBRUARY 2014
As at 0430 hours AEDST Tuesday 18 February 2014

- Protest action at the Manus Island Offshore Processing Centre escalated dramatically at about 11pm AEDST last night (February 17) and continued through until after 1am.
- · Order was restored about 2am and the facility is now calm.
- A number of transferees were injured during the protest activity and are receiving medical treatment.
- · All staff were evacuated from the facility when the situation deteriorated about midnight. The PNG Police mobile squad took action to restore order to the site and encourage transferees to return inside the perimeter of facility.
- It is believed several hundred transferees were involved in the disturbance, with a number of those moving from the facility to the adjoining road.
- At the height of the disturbance at about 1am, the PNG Police fired shots. PNG Police did not enter the facility at any time.
- G4S is engaging with transferees and reiterating the risks involved with undertaking violent protest activity.
- A preliminary assessment of the facility has been undertaken. While there is property damage to some areas, it is not significant. All compounds have been classed as habitable and there is contingency accommodation available for use, if required. Damage primarily relates to fencing. Water supply has been interrupted in parts of the facility and one compound is currently without lighting.

- Efforts are being made to restore the facility to normal operations. The medical, dining and kitchen areas were undamaged and breakfast will be prepared as normal.
- As at 330am, the health services provider IHMS was treating 77 transferees as a result of the distrubance of the 77, 15 were assessed as suffering more serious injuries. Unfortunately one of these has now passed away.
- One individual is being treated for a suspected gunshot wound to the buttocks.
- Arrangements will be made to ensure people continue to receive prompt and appropriate medical treatment, including the use of the Lorengau Hospital and Port Moresby Hospital, as required.
- No DIBP or service provider staff were injured in the incident.
- Comcare not notified.

- \cdot $\;$ Emergency Response Team (ERT) has been deployed and G4S CSOs have been extracted from Mike Compound.
- The ERT has managed to move all transferees back into the compound.
- · One G4S officer has been injured and transferred to IHMS.



- · At 1819 local time G4S officers and PNG Security Safety officers delivered dinner to the transferees in Lorengaru Prison.
- · When handed their dinner the transferees threw their meals on the floor and told the officers that if they were not released tonight they would self harm.
- At 1912 local time all compounds at the centre remain calm.
- · 4 dogs have now been deployed to patrol inside and outside the compounds.

- At 1734 local time a large number of transferees who did not want to participate in the protest were transferred to Bravo compound.
- · A large number of transferees have gathered in Delta compound for a meeting.
- · At 1747 all non essential staff were moved out of the OPC. Only security staff and response teams remain.
- At 1805 G4S met with transferees in oscar compound.
- The transferees stated that they wanted the 8 detained by police yesterday returned to the OPC tonight or they would undertake action at midnight.

G4S told the transferees that they are liaising with PNG Police and it is likely the police process will be completed by tomorrow and the 8 transferees returned.
 They also told the transferees that if they continued to demonstrated that they too could face criminal charges.



- · A face to photo match of transferees has not been conducted at this time.

- · As at 2120hrs, all compounds were reported as quiet but tense. All transferees that had absconded have been returned to the centre.
- It has also been reported that a number of local Manusians (and local G4S) were involved in throwing rocks back at the transferees.
- Six transferees have been detained by RPNGC and taken off site for questioning with one other transferee sought by Police. This transferee is currently receiving medical treatment at the IHMS clinic.
- There have been 19 transferees in total admitted to the clinic for a range of conditions ranging from a laceration to the chest, another with what appears to be a serious cut to the neck. Another two were reported as being unconscious when brought to the clinic.
- All staff are reported as safe and accounted for though two G4S officers are believed to have suffered minor injuries.





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

ECO open at 1347hrss on Monday 17th February 2014 due to tensions rising in Mike compound.

Between 1348hrs and 1548hrs tension in the compounds fluctuated between calm and elevated.

Between 1524hrs and 1548hrs ongoing dialogue occurred between G4S personnel and Transferees in Foxtrot; at this meeting the Transferees requested that G4S National staff not participate in discussion.

Due to a protracted period of calm, at 1548hrs the ECO was stood down.

At 1644hrs protest action commenced in the centre of Oscar Compound. A group pf 50 transferees were heard to chant in English "my friend" and "Death to PNG". All other compounds reported as being calm. At 1652hrs Oscar transferees became agitated with many moving around the compound.

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At 1702hrs a number of transferees requested to be moved from Oscar Compound as they did not want to be involved in any protest activity. Threats were made to Delta Compound transferees at this time by Oscar Compound transferees because Delta Compound had not supported Oscar Compound in protest action. The protest action in Oscar Compound grew to 70 in number. As a result of escalating tensions, 2 x IRT units were stood to. Non-essential personnel were removed from the compounds at 1712hrs and at 1728hrs a meeting was held in Delta Compound (D3). As a result of ongoing tension the off duty IRT was stood to and deployed from the Hardstand 1 Accommodation Area to RPC F Block and the off duty SSO Shift was deployed from the Bibby to the MIRPC.

At 1819hrs the Mobile Squad were engaged with discussion with Oscar Compound Transferees about the 6 transferees from Oscar Compound and 2 from Foxtrot Compound that were arrested and held at the Lorengau Police station; this incident is seen as contributing to the increase in tensions at Oscar Compound. At 1839 the lights were reported out on the perimeter of Mike Compound; this was the first of several power failures at Mike during the evening – power was restored at 1845hrs. This incident also increased the tensions in Mike compound. At around this time Control requested an understanding of the strength of the Police Mobile Squad in preparation for a future requirement; reported to be 46 personnel on duty including a K9 unit with 4 dogs. After light was restored to Mike at 1845hrs there was an increase in tension between Oscar and Foxtrot Compounds which was exacerbated by the Iranian Nationals in the compounds threatening non participants in any protest action.

At 1938hrs there was a disturbance in Mike Compound when a local employee passed and was jeered and whistled at by transferees; this activity became a significant event with up to 120 Transferees engaged in loud whistling, jeering and chanting. At this stage a decision was made by the G4S (0A) to remove local guards and other personnel from the Regional General Manager Centre as their presence was proving an aggravation to an already tense time. compounds reported calm but at 2035hrs there were complaints from transferees about the slowness of food deliveries; it is possible that slow food deliveries again added to the elevated stress levels in compounds. At approximately 2000hrs a Mobile Squad dog unit entered the MIRPC and conducted a familiarization of the Centre East (Zone 1) and a second dog team conducted a familiarization of Centre West (Golf 2 to Green Zone). It was reported that stones were thrown at the dogs in Green Zone. It was not possible to identify the perpetrators as they wearing masks. At 2034hrs the Mobile Police were in location at the Police posts in front of Mike and Oscar Compounds on Route Pugwash. By 2055hrs the situation was calm enough for a shift change in G4S personnel and discussion about standing down the Mobile Squad.

However, at 2125hrs information was received that tension would escalate after evening meals. This was reinforced at 2132hrs when increasing reports were received that Transferees in Foxtrot had started to wear running shoes (an indicator of potential protest action). In addition information was received from transferees that a breach from Foxtrot to Mike was imminent. At this time a decision was made to not release the day shift and to ensure the Police Mobile Squad also remained on duty. At 2114hrs the generators for Mike Compound stopped which meant that there were no lights external or internal in Mike Compound. This incident saw a significant increase in tension in Mike compound and it was reported that Transferees were wearing masks and throwing stones towards Foxtrot and at G4S personnel on the perimeter (Pugwash). This stone throwing escalated into a formed protest and a breach of the Mike Compound fences towards Foxtrot compound and the calling of a Code Green at 2144hrs.

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At this time Regional Senior Operations Manager (0C) directed two out the three IRT teams to a forming up point behind shipping containers adjacent to the Golf 2 gate on route Pugwash. Staff was noticed taking cover behind the Guard hut which was being stoned by transferees. On order and under command of 0C the IRT teams adopted there tactical formations and moved to close the gap in the fence using shields; which they did. This enabled the G4S personnel taking cover behind the guard post to be extracted from that location to safety outside the Green Zone on Route Pugwash. Due to an overwhelming preponderance of incoming missiles from not only Mike Compound but also to their rear from Foxtrot Compound the decision was made to withdraw from the Greenzone to a position of safety outside Golf 2 at which point the IRT held ground. Using their shields the IRT team provided a means of cover to other G4S personnel in that location which enabled them to extract from Golf 2 location back to main gate Golf 1 location using shipping containers along Route Pugwash for cover from further stoning. During this withdrawal G4S personnel sustained injuries.

While the incident in Mike was unfolding, Transferees in Foxtrot compound were beginning to identify themselves as not being involved in any violence and asking for G4S protection. While there was protest activity at the Mike end of the Foxtrot compound, this was a significant indicator that further protest action was going to occur in Foxtrot compound. The tension in the centre was escalated further at 2151hrs when it was reported that Delta Compound Transferees were starting to arm themselves with makeshift homemade weapons.

At 2153hrs it was reported that a Transferee was badly injured and moved to the Mike dining facility. By 2154hrs there were two compounds engaged in violent protest (Mike and Foxtrot) and significant potential for a third and fourth (Delta and Oscar) to commence violent protest also. At 2156hrs the lights went out in Foxtrot which increased protest activity (rock throwing). Due to a number of personnel being injured, at 2157hrs the decision was made to use the IRT to form a defensive block in Mike Compound, adjacent to the Kitchen (but forward of the kitchen rear service doors) to enable a wounded Transferee to be extracted from the canteen; which occurred. The rioting Transferees applied so much pressure to the IRT team that it was reinforced with the second team and held ground. The pressure increased on the teams to such an extent that Deputy Regional General Manager

(0B) requested a third IRT team asset to deploy allow the teams to move forward and maneuvered inside Mike Compound. It was at this time that it was reported that Mobile Squad was armed with shotguns and semi-automatic weapons.

At 2159hrs the compound Supervisor from Oscar Compound advised that missiles were being thrown into Oscar Compound from Foxtrot Compound; this may or may not have been possible but was reported by the compound supervisor. At 2201hrs the fence between Mike and Foxtrot compounds was breached and at 2203hrs the lights in Mike Compound went out for a third time. These two events significantly increased violent protest action as protesters were able to use the cover of darkness to attack G4S personnel with relative impunity.

At 2205hrs it was reported that the gates between Mike and Foxtrot had been destroyed and that protestors now had free and open access between both compounds. Protestors from Foxtrot compound were spotted arming themselves and running into Mike Compound attacking occupants of Mike. Between 2205hrs and 2213hrs, when elements of the third IRT were withdrawn to 0C location at Golf 1, violent protest action increased with protestors throwing large rocks, metal bars, chairs and any other items that could be used as a missile. During this period the off duty IRT was stood to and all non IRT personnel were removed from the vicinity of gate G1 and A7. In Mike compound riot action

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intensified with at least one protestor climbing onto a roof and using that vantage point to throw missiles on protestors and G4S personnel before climbing down. Other protestors were using fire hoses in Mike Compound to spray water at each other and G4S personnel; the water to Mike compound was cutoff in response. In Mike Compound, under command, the IRT pushed forward and forced the transferees back. At this time the IRT was not only was being attacked with projectiles from two directions but also by transferees with metal bars and lumps of wood. It was reported at 2215hrs that Mike compound transferees had now armed themselves with poles and metal bars and were attacking the IRT directly. Finally at 2218hrs the IRT line was broken by the overwhelming force of the protestors and was forced to make a tactical withdrawal through gate Golf G7 and at that point go firm and create a block against the gate to prevent any attempt to breach. As a precautionary measure to prevent breaching of the fence line at gate Golf 2 an IRT detachment was tasked to go firm against the gate.

At 2219hrs it was determined that additional personnel were required and the off duty day shift were called back to the centre by 0A to provide support to 0C activities in Foxtrot compound. At 2220hrs the Mike generator was restarted and lighting restored to the compound. However between 2200hrs and 2220hrs violent and uncontrolled rioting was occurring between Mike and Foxtrot compound with protestors attacking each other, G4S personnel and incidentally Mobile Squad personnel on Pugwash (using missiles).

Finally at 2237hrs 0B took the decision to abandon Mike Compound and withdraw all G4S personnel to the vicinity of gate Golf 1 to allow reconstitution of the IRT teams, rest and planning for further activities. At approximately 2248hrs, 0B advised that the responsibility for restoring law and order in Mike Compound now belonged to the Mobile Squad.

On the withdrawal of the IRT to gate G1 location 0C took control of IRT elements and retasked them to provide protection to Foxtrot personnel who did not want to partake in the protest. For their own protection, Foxtrot personnel not involved in the protest were moved to the internet room for safety and 15 x IRT members deployed to Foxtrot main gate Alpha 6.

At 2259hrs IHMS started to withdraw from the centre and established a field medical facility at the Bibby with a mass casualty triage facility on the wharf alongside the Bibby.

At 2306hrs the ECO (main) relocated from a bus outside Golf 1 to the Bibby under command of R	GM.
A tactical coordinator was left at the G4S office to establish a control point at the G4S office.	Αt
this time the on the ground commanders remained on site	

At 2315hrs all IRT units entered Foxtrot compound and pushed violent and armed Transferees to the Green Zone area and established safe defence lines between Transferee accommodation P block and I block.

At 2320hrs IHMS clinic was cleared and all remaining personnel (staff and patients) were relocated to the Bibby location.

At 2322hrs a number of gun shots were fired by the mobile squad in the vicinity of Mike Compound and at 2324hrs a CS Gas grenade landed in the vicinity of G4S main administration building.

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At 2326hrs Oscar compound Transferees became violent and breached the fence along route Charlie. At this time, multiple code Greens were reported in Oscar compound where Transferees had armed themselves with improvised weapons. In order to prevent a breach of the safe area established between Gate A7 and D9, G4S SSOs established the barrier between edge of Transferee accommodation block Delta 9 and Delta 4. Transferees from Oscar compound attempted to Breach the barrier and enter into the MIRPC administration area. G4S staff managed to maintain the barrier.

At 2327hrs the IRT in Foxtrot Compound reported that they had a visibility into Mike compound and reported police units inside Mike compound. Observation of ongoing violence observed between a) Police on Transferees and b) transferee on transferee

At 2329hrs Charlie Sierra 1 advised that he would commence evacuation of Charlie and Bravo compounds, relocating the transferees to the PNGDF Oval and to ensure their safety and security. At the same time IRT Team 1 were confronted by a violent transferee group at the Mike Compound gate into Foxtrot compound.

At approximately 2330hrs Police Mobile Squad withdrew from Mike compound and 0B and A1 entered into Mike compound via route Pugwash with number of SSOs. Evacuation of casualties from Mike compound commences. At this time Romeo 1 advised she had lost control of her national IRT team members who have dispersed into the immediate area of Mike Compound.

Due to the ongoing risk to personnel at 2337hrs the Control Scribe and Radio Operator were withdrawn to the ECO main organization at the Bibby location.

In Mike Compound all Transferees appeared to be frightened and distracted. Under direction of G4S personnel all Transferees moved into the Mike compound dining hall without issue. Given the number of casualties 2 x medical staff from IHMS deployed into Mike compound for further triage of casualties.

A review of Foxtrot compound at approximately 0005hrs indicated that there were no transferees in Foxtrot compound.

At approximately 0100hrs G4S SSOs managed to re-engage with Oscar compound Transferees and push them back to the compound. G4S RGM starts mediation with transferees to bring an end to the protest. All Oscar compound Transferees in the compound and things start to settle down and by 0120hrs the Transferees inform G4S SSO that they have finished for the night.

After assessing the situation G4S RDGM ordered to relocate Transferees from Navy sports Field to compounds. Movements commenced at approximately 0200hrs.

G4S Acting Centre Manager ■assessed the damage in Mike compound and recommends accommodating all Transferees in recreational areas within Mike compound.

Mike compound Transferee accommodation areas, building MA1 to MA8, declared as being unfit for habitation due to the level of damage to buildings. Damage report to be follow.

Access to Mike compound accommodation area blocked using ISO containers. This also prevented access to the breach in the perimeter wire at the rear of building MA8.

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All Transferees in Mike compound issued with stretcher beds. Mike compound Transferees accommodated in 3 x TV rooms, Internet telephone rooms/ Recreational area and Open recreational area. No Transferees accommodate in dining room. At around 0400hrs medically treated Transferees start to arrive from IHMS and are returned to their compounds. ■) had been declared dead at the At 0600hrs it was reported that Transferee Lorengau hospital. This incident was verbally reported to Provincial Police Commander L and he ordered that no one was to enter the Mike Compound Accommodation area until a Police investigation is completed. 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
