**h.** The total cost of retrieval and quarantine charged to the Department of Health was \$2.01 million.

**i.** The Department of Health activated the Human Health Response Zone power under the *Biosecurity Act 2015* to support operations at the Christmas Island and Howard Springs quarantine facilities and Learmonth air base. This power was implemented to assist with managing the entry and exit of persons to prevent the further spread of COVID-19 within Australia.

**j.** The Department of Health worked with the National Critical Care and Trauma Response Centre (NCCTRC) to deploy AUSMAT teams to manage the medical needs on repatriation flights and at Christmas Island and Howard Springs quarantine facilities.

(i) The total cost of retrieval and quarantine charged to the Department of Health was \$2.01 million.

**k.**

(i) ABF assumed Operational Lead for the 2nd phase of the Operations (flights from Wuhan China and Japan).

(ii) Christmas Island North West Point and support infrastructures are Australian Border Force (ABF) managed facilities. ABF assumed Operational Lead for the 3rd phase of repatriation (from Wuhan and Japan) from arrival to return to home jurisdiction after the 14 days of quarantine. Howard Springs is operated by the Northern Territory Government.

(iii) The Department of Health was the lead agency for the health component of the mission. The Department used the Australian Medical Assistance Team (AUSMAT) resources managed by the National Critical Care and Trauma Response Centre (NCCTRC) in Darwin.
