- (i) In the years 1950, 1960 and 1970, the Department of the Interior employed, respectively, 473, 443 and 996 temporary employees in all regions of Australia. The Department was abolished in 1972 with its functions split between nine other Departments.
- (ii) The Department of Works and Housing existed from 1945-1952 and employed 2340 staff in the ACT and 4237 staff in NSW in 1950. This figure, however, includes those employed on both a permanent and a temporary basis, and includes staff working within the War Service Homes Division. From 1952 to 1973 the department was named the Department of Works. In 1963, the Department of Housing was established. In 1973 these departments merged and became the Department of Housing and Construction. The department later merged with then separated from the Department of Transport in the early 1980s. During this period from 1982 - 1983 the number of employees on a regional basis was not recorded, however, aggregate Australia-wide figures can be seen at Attachment M.
- (iii) Figures for the Department of Administrative Services cannot be obtained for the period prior to 1980, however, staff employment numbers on an Australia-wide basis for the aggregate number of permanent and temporary employees in 1980 and 1990 can be seen at Attachment M.
- (iv) From 1932 to 1968 the Department of the Interior was responsible for education within the ACT. From 1968 to 1972, the agency responsible for education within the ACT was the

Department of Education and Science. Employment figures as between States and Territories are not currently known by Finance, however, the total numbers of permanent and temporary employees is at 'Education and Science Dept' at Attachment M. ACT schools were initially established and administered by the NSW Education Department. A separate ACT Education system was established in 1976 with the ACT Schools Authority. The Authority conducted pre-schools, primary schools and secondary colleges in the ACT on behalf of the Commonwealth. The *ACT Education Act 2004* abolished the ACT Schools Authority and responsibility for the operation of the ACT school system then vested with the ACT Department of Employment, Education and Training. Employment figures for this Department are not currently known by Finance.

- (v) The Department of Supply existed until 1974. In 1950, the department employed 4 staff in the ACT and 617 staff in SA on either a permanent or temporary basis. Figures currently available to Finance from 1960 and 1970 do not indicate the region in which the staff were employed; however the break-down of permanent and temporary employees can be seen at Attachment M.
- (vi) The Postmaster-General's Department existed between 1901 and 1975. In 1950, the then Postmaster-General's Office employed 278 staff in ACT and 27963 staff in NSW on a mix of permanent and temporary arrangements (but with most staff employed on a permanent basis). For 1960 and 1970, region-specific figures for the ACT and NSW are not currently known by Finance, however, the overall figures can be seen at Attachment M and the high proportion of employees engaged on a permanent basis can also be noted. In 1975 the Postmaster-General's Department was abolished and replaced with the Postal and Communications Department which was responsible for overseeing the newly created Australian Postal Commission and the Australian Telecommunications Commission. By 1980 responsibility for the provision of Australian postal services fell to the Department of Communications and in 1987 responsibility for Australian postal services was transferred to the Department of Transport and Communications. Employment figures for 1980 and 1990 can be seen under those portfolios at Attachment M.
- (vii) The Government Printing Office in the ACT commenced operations on 14 July 1927. The functions of the Government Printing Office were assumed by the Australian Government Printing Service which was created in July 1970 within the Department of Treasury. Employment records for the Australian Government Printing Office in 1980 can be seen at Attachment M, noting that the number of staff is not available on a region-by-region basis.
- (viii) The Research Weapons Establishment existed from 1955-1978 and staff employment figures are not currently known by Finance.
- (ix) The Defence Science and Technology Organisation was created in 1974. Staff employment numbers are not currently known by Finance. The agency fell within the Defence portfolio and aggregate figures for the Department of Defence are available at Attachment M.
- (x) The Defence Research Centre was a collection of separate laboratories created within the Defence Science and Technology Organisation in 1978. Staff employment figures specific to the Defence Research Centre are not currently known by Finance. The agency fell within

the Defence portfolio and aggregate figures for the Department of Defence are available at Attachment M.

- (xi) The Australian Broadcasting Corporation was established on 17 May 1932 by the *Australian Broadcasting Commission Act 1932*. Staff employment numbers of the organisation are not currently known by Finance.
- (xii) The Australian Atomic Energy Commission was established on 17 April 1953 by the *Atomic Energy Act 1953*. In 1987 the Commission was renamed the Australian Nuclear Science and Technology Organisation (ANSTO) by the operation of the *Australian Nuclear Science and Technology Organisation Act 1987*. Staff employment numbers are not currently known by Finance.
- (xiii) The ACT Electricity Authority (ACTEA) was established on 1 July 1963 by the *Australian Capital Territory Electricity Supply Act 1962*. In 1988 ACTEA was combined with the water branch of ACT Administration to form the Australian Capital Territory Electricity and Water Authority (ACTEW Authority) (pursuant to the *Electricity and Water Ordinance 1988*). From the time of ACT self-government (11 May 1989) the Commonwealth was no longer responsible for the organisation. Staff employment numbers are not currently known by Finance.
- (xiv) The NT Electricity Commission was established under the *Northern Territory Electricity Commission Ordinance* in 1978. The NT Electricity Commission was part of the Northern-Territory Government. Staff employment numbers are not currently known by Finance.
- (xv) The Australian Antarctic Division was established in 1948 and as an agency has typically fallen within the purview of the department responsible for the environment (currently this is the Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities (DSEWPAC)). As a result, agency-specific employment figures are not currently known by Finance.
- (xvi) The *Australian National Airlines Commission* was created in 1946 by the operation of the *Australian National Airlines Act 1945*. Trans Australian Airlines was the trading name of the commercial airline business operated by the Commission. Staff employment figures are not currently known by Finance.
- (xvii) The agency now known as the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO) was created in 1926. Staff employment figures are not currently known by Finance.
