Senator SIEWERT: ... Could I now ask a question of Volunteering Australia on notice. You raised before the issue of the proportion of volunteers that are in that older category. Could you provide a breakdown of the volunteers under the age groups.

Volunteering Australia highlights that according to the 2016 Census results, there are 3,620,726 people engaging in voluntary work for an organisation or group in Australia. Of the total volunteer engagement in Australia, 278,496 people are aged 55 to 59. A more comprehensive breakdown of volunteers aged 55 to 59 indicates:

- 59,241 are aged 55 years
- 56,858 are aged 56 years
- 55,116 are aged 57 years
- 54,566 are aged 58 years
- 52,723 are aged 59 years iii

Census data pinpoints that there is a higher amount of volunteers in total, aged 55 to 59 in New South Wales, Australia's most populated state, at 86,927. This is followed by Victoria at 69,959, Queensland at 54,643, Western Australia at 27,628, South Australia at 23,266, Tasmania at 8,159, Australian Capital Territory at 5,328, Northern Territory at 2,470 and finally Other Territories at 118. iv

The 2016 Census data also highlights that there are a higher proportion of female volunteers, than male volunteers in each age group aged 55 to 59. In total, there are 150,389 female volunteers aged 55 to 59, compared to 128,106 male volunteers. This reinforces data collected by Volunteering Australia, that women are more likely to volunteer than men.
