Is it reasonable to expect every single consumer in Australia to have to check that their clothes are not made by slaves of the Chinese Communist Party?
Or is it reasonable for the Australian Federal Parliament to ensure that the products of this industrial force labour does not make it to our stores?
I suggest the latter.
