I refer to the public hearing of the Joint Standing Committee on Treaties on 27 October 2025, at which witnesses answered questions in relation to the:

- *Agreement between the Government of Australia and the Government of the Republic of Colombia relating to Air Services;*
- *Agreement between the Government of Australia and the Government of the Republic of Peru relating to Air Services; and*
- *Agreement between the Government of Australia and the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia relating to Air Services.*

Treaties to be brought forward for consideration by the Committee

The Department is seeking to progress the Air Services Agreements with Nauru, Kiribati and Cambodia for the Committee's consideration.

These will be followed soon afterward by Agreements with Oman and the Seychelles, which were signed in October 2024 and subsequently Agreements with Latvia, Mongolia and Rwanda.

The belly of international passenger flights transport high-value, time-sensitive, and perishable goods. This can include fresh food, electronics, pharmaceuticals and cosmetic products.
