Growing business and a sustainable future for developing countries

Parliament's Foreign Affairs and Aid sub-committee will hold a series of public hearings over the next two weeks as part of its inquiry into the role of the private sector in economic growth and poverty reduction in the Indo-Pacific region.

Witnesses including those from government, multilateral partners, and private sector advocates will provide wide-ranging evidence addressing efforts underway by Australian and international businesses to promote development and reduce poverty in the Indo-Pacific region.

Sub-committee Chair Sharman Stone said embracing the private sector as a partner in promoting development in the region is an opportunity to profit from its experience in establishing sustainable businesses.

"Profit and development can go hand in hand", she said. "The objective of business is to return a profit; however this doesn't mean that social goals and responsibilities are not also an important objective of a company's operations."
