### Answer:

The ascdigitaldiscovery.slack.com workspace was created on 22 June 2018 to support the development of several Australian Sports Commission (ASC) corporate digital projects. The workspace enabled collaboration between the ASC Digital team, technology vendors and a national sporting organisation to design these projects. This workspace is completely unrelated to the Community Sport Infrastructure grant program. Slack is not an official ASC corporate system but was used for this purpose as most of participating technology vendors had an established practice of using Slack as their preferred online collaboration method.
