I feel that what I have to say is relevant to the way allegations of abuse were dealt with in the past, specifically to the reporting of abuse at HMAS *Leeuwin* in 1963. Stevan Coll, a former junior recruit and a person with many years service in the RAN, publicly stated on the ABC's 7.30 Report last year that when he did report multiple cases of abuse to the Naval Dockyard Police in *Leeuwin*, he was told to 'go away and make the best of it.' I have spoken with Mr. Coll on several occasions and he is content to have gone on the record and has not lodged any complaint through the DLAPiper Review. I was abused during my time at Leeuwin, also in 1963, but I did not report those incidents, partly due to downright fear and also the knowledge that things would very likely get worse for me. I have lodged a complaint regarding my treatment at JRTE. We, as junior recruits, were at the absolute bottom of a tightly-organised hierarchy, powereless even to complain about ill-treatment.
