

## Submission to the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Social Policy and Legal Affairs inquiry into constitutional reform and referendums

- 1. The Department of Finance (Finance) welcomes the opportunity to provide a submission to the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Social Policy and Legal Affairs Inquiry into Constitutional Reform and Referendums.
- 2. This submission responds to item (3) of the Inquiry's Terms of Reference.

## **Role of Finance**

- 3. Under Part 5 of the Administrative Arrangement Orders (AAO), Finance has responsibility for electoral matters.
- 4. Finance implements this responsibility by providing policy advice to government, including with regard to the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918* (Electoral Act) and the *Referendum (Machinery Provisions) Act 1984* (Referendum Act).
- 5. Finance provides advice on the framework for conducting referendums pursuant to the Referendum Act. Finance does not advise on the issue and question that is the subject of the referendum.
- 6. Finance also supports the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC), an independent statutory authority within the Finance portfolio that conducts referendums.

## Referendums

- 7. The decision whether to hold a referendum to amend the Constitution under section 128 of the Constitution is a matter for Government.
- 8. Where the Government decides it is appropriate to pursue a referendum proposal, Finance provides advice on the legislative and operational framework, including amendments to the Referendum Act and funding, in consultation with the AEC.
- 9. The design of any referendum question is a matter for the Attorney-General's Department, which is responsible for constitutional law, including the development of referendum proposals.

## Reform

10. The Government has undertaken substantive electoral reform to modernise electoral processes through the Electoral Act, which where possible has included consequential amendments to the Referendum Act.
