Prior to this, in 2002, 2003, 2006, 2011 and 2014, NCEPH received funding from pharmaceutical companies GlaxoSmithKline, Bristol-Myers Sqibb, Astrazeneca and Commonwealth Serum Laboratories for work on: global influenza modelling; costs of medical care for hepatitis B virus; otitis media; and human papillomavirus.
