Senator Kristina Keneally asked:

Since 20 March 2020, please provide details of the international air passenger arrival cap. Please provide the total cap on a monthly basis. Please also provide the same data broken down by state and territory on a monthly basis.

Answer:

International passenger arrivals caps were first introduced in July 2020. The table below outlines weekly arrivals caps for each state by month, noting there were variations within specific months as outlined in the notes.

Notes

* In NSW the international passenger arrival caps were subject to temporary reductions from 3,150 to 2,450 on 20 July 2020 to 27 September 2020, and from 3,010 to 1,505 from 15 January 2021 to 15 February 2021.

** In Victoria all international passenger arrivals were suspended from 1 July 2020 to 6 December 2020 and from 14 February 2021 to 7 April 2021.

*** In Queensland international passenger arrivals were reduced from 1,300 to 650 from 15 January 2021 to 14 February 2021 and again from 1,300 to 650 from 31 March to 30 April 2021.

**** In SA international passenger arrivals were suspended from 21 November to 30 November 2020, and returned at 490 arrivals in December 2020 to 14 February 2021, and were temporarily suspended from 25 April 2021 to 27 April 2021 and from 26 July 2021 to 27 July 2021.

***** In WA international passenger arrivals were reduced from 1,025 to 512 from 15 January 2021 to 14 February 2021 and again from 29 April until 31 May 2021. WA cap temporarily returned to 530 in June 2021.

***** All caps halved from 14 July 2021 to 31 August 2021.

The Northern Territory, the Australian Capital Territory and Tasmania have also received international repatriation flights during the period.
