**Julian Hill asked the following question:**

1. In the last round of estimates, it was revealed that in Safer Communities Fund Round 6 Early Intervention Stream, the Minister intervened to award two grants worth \$2.35 million to applicants who were not recommended by the department.

What projects missed out on funding, or had their funding reduced to facilitate the additional \$2.35 million in funding?

**The response to the question is as follows:**

Two applications that the department had recommended for funding did not receive funding, as detailed below.

- The department had recommended funding any two of the following five applications:
  - Australian Red Cross Society for the 'WorkREDi' project
  - Inspire Youth and Family Services Inc for the 'Love your Hood' project
  - Feed the Little Children Inc. for the 'Improving Criminal Justice Outcomes for Children through Food Security' project
  - Wisa Wellbeing in Schools Australasia Pacific Limited for the 'Safe Supportive Schools' project
  - Deadly Connections Community and Justice Services Limited for the 'Deadly Diversion and Justice Pathways' project.
- These five applications received the same aggregate merit score of 78 but (if the department's recommendations were accepted in full) there was only funding available to approve two of them.
- Ultimately, none of the five applications received funding because the Assistant Minister elected to fund two applications that the department had not recommended.

2. In Safer Communities Fund Round 6 Early Intervention Stream, the following grant applications were recommended for funding by the department. They were ranked higher than 2 grants approved by the Minister:

- Wesley Mission Queensland
- Marra Worra Worra Aboriginal Corporation
- Creating Chances Trust
- Inspiring Better Futures Foundation
- Hillsong Citycare
- St Vincent De Paul Society Queensland

a. Can the department provide a summary of the grant application including a description of the projects.

b. Were there any other projects that were not awarded funding that were recommended by the department?

c. Why did the Minister decide to not award them funding, and fund projects with lower ranks instead?

d. Was written reasoning provided? If so please provide.

**The response to the questions is as follows:**

References to the department below refer to the Department of Home Affairs which had policy responsibility for the Safer Communities Fund at the time.

A summary of the grant applications for the six entities identified is attached. Of the six entities:

- four were approved for funding by the Assistant Minister in line with the department's recommendations: Wesley Mission Queensland, Creating Chances Trust, Inspiring Better Futures Foundation and St Vincent De Paul Society Queensland.
- two were not approved for funding by the Assistant Minister after taking into account information identified by the department through its due diligence processes: Marra Worra Worra Aboriginal Corporation and Hillsong Citycare.

Two applications that the department had recommended for funding did not receive funding, as detailed below.

- The department had recommended funding any two of the following five applications:
  - Australian Red Cross Society for the 'WorkREDi' project
  - Inspire Youth and Family Services Inc for the 'Love your Hood' project
  - Feed the Little Children Inc. for the 'Improving Criminal Justice Outcomes for

- Children through Food Security' project
- Wisa Wellbeing in Schools Australasia Pacific Limited for the 'Safe Supportive Schools' project
- Deadly Connections Community and Justice Services Limited for the 'Deadly Diversion and Justice Pathways' project.
- These five applications received the same aggregate merit score of 78 but (if the department's recommendations were accepted in full) there was only funding available to approve two of them.
- Ultimately, none of the five applications received funding because the Assistant Minister elected to fund two applications that the department had not recommended.

In accordance with paragraph 4.12 of the *Commonwealth Grants Rules and Guidelines 2017* (CGRGs), Ministers may approve grants that are not recommended by officials, subject to meeting certain reporting requirements. The Assistant Minister's reasons for approving two grants not recommended by the department are attached.

WESLEY MISSION QUEENSLAND	It's A Wrap	<p>Wesley Mission Brisbane is an incorporated association based in Chermside, Queensland located approximately 10km north of the state capital Brisbane. Established in 1907, the Applicant is a community service provider, providing accessible and flexible services to older people, those living with a disability or mental illness, Aboriginal and Torres Strait islanders, refugees and children and families.</p> <p>The Applicant asserts that when vulnerability, disconnection from family, boredom, a lack of self-esteem or frustration sets in, crime can be seen as an outlet or feel like the only avenue left. The Applicant considers that there is a significant gap in local services for young people at high risk of engaging in crime or anti-social behaviour which could be otherwise be met by providing funding to support them to overcome low cost barriers to achieving life skills and to resist the temptation crime offers. The Applicant identifies the project area as a crime hotspot, referencing the Queensland Government's identification of the Gold Coast as one of six crime hotspots within Queensland.</p> <p>The proposed project will engage approximately 250 youth who have been identified as at risk of being engaged in criminal and anti-social behaviour. The participants will be identified through current partnerships with QLD Police, QLD Youth Justice and community youth services.</p>
MARRA WORRA WORRA ABORIG NAL CORPORATION	Fitzroy Valley Youth ConneXion	<p>The Marra Worra Worra Aboriginal Corporation is an incorporated not for profit organisation located in Fitzroy Crossing Western Australia, approximately 1,827km north-east of Perth. Commencing operations in 1981, the Applicant operates a resource agency in the region, offering a variety of services including housing support, employment programs, disability services, social enterprises, and youth programs.</p> <p>The Applicant states that youth crime and anti-social behaviour are critical issues in the Fitzroy Valley with over 90 percent of offenders being juveniles. The Applicant asserts that a significant portion of youth anti-social behaviour or crime occurs when youth are out on the street, that some young people are on the street at night to get away from home as they don't see it as a safe place to sleep at night and that some young people are not aware of support services available to them and/or are uncomfortable accessing support without an advocate. The Applicant asserts that 176 students (81 percent) of the local high school are at severe risk of disengagement.</p> <p>This project will focus on marginalised young people aged 12-24, addressing anti-social behaviour by youth at high risk, and supporting them to develop life, education, and vocational skills, preventing them from becoming entrenched in the criminal justice system. The Applicant currently engages with at-risk youth through its existing programs.</p>
THE TRUSTEE FOR CREAT NG CHANCES TRUST	Creating Chances for young people in Penrith	<p>The Trustee for Creating Chances Trust is an incorporated not for profit organisation based in Lidcombe, Sydney. The Applicant seeks to deliver evidence-based programs promoting positive youth development through sport to support at-risk youth who are disengaged from education and employment. The project will be delivered in Penrith, NSW, approximately 55km west of Sydney's CBD. Penrith has a total population of 201,597, of which approximately 13% are aged between 10 and 19 years old (ABS 2016).</p> <p>The Applicant asserts that crime and anti-social behaviour is prevalent within the project delivery region, and specifically that crime rates in the area are well above New South Wales state averages. The Applicant notes that in the Penrith LGA in 2014, domestic violence, drug offences and home break and enters were recorded to be 1066, 1181 and 1057 respectively, compared to the NSW state-wide averages of 191, 334 and 223 respectively. The Applicant furthered this by detailing that the Penrith LGA ranked 14th and 6th highest in the state for 'Robbery without a Weapon' and 'Stealing from a Person' respectively.</p> <p>The project is a set of three ten-week programs. This project will target up to 160 at-risk youth per year, or 320 over the life of the project.</p>
INSPIRING BRIGHTER FUTURES FOUNDATION PTY LTD	Onwards & Upwards wellbeing and mentoring program	<p>Inspiring Brighter Futures Foundation Pty Ltd is an incorporated not for profit organisation based in Brisbane, Queensland. The Applicant provides services, mentoring and support to enhance practical skills and assist in the transition from unemployment to work.</p> <p>The Applicant asserts that anti-social behaviour is a key concern for schools in the Greater Brisbane and Townsville regions, with the Applicant noting that youth who have poor educational attainment, social participation and interpersonal difficulties are more likely to engage in criminal and offending behaviours. The Applicant asserts that the targeted regions experience high socio-economic disadvantage, particularly poor economic, education, health and living standards. The Applicant references Socio-Economic Indexes for Areas (SE FA) data indicating that Logan City was in the lowest 41 per cent of LGAs in Australia, Deception Bay was in the lowest 10 per cent and Townsville was in the lowest 62 percent (SEIFA, 2016).</p> <p>This project is a peer and mentoring support program to enhance the self-confidence, self-esteem and self-motivation of participants. This project will target up to 11,000 participants aged 14-17. The participants will be sourced through consultation with nominated schools. The project will be located across eight sites in Queensland, including South Brisbane, Railway Estate, Deception Bay, Palm Beach, Victoria Point, Slacks Creek, Caboolture and Sherwood. This project is an expansion of early intervention activities that the Applicant currently undertakes.</p>

HILLSONG CITYCARE	Westfield Garden City (WGC) Youth Strategy	<p>Hillsong CityCare is an incorporated not for profit organisation based in Norwest, a suburb located in the capital of New South Wales, Sydney. The Applicant is an extension of the local Hillsong Church that seeks to support healthy families and promote safe, inclusive communities through early intervention programs, emergency food relief, volunteer services and Christmas gift programs for impoverished families.</p> <p>The Applicant asserts that the Mt Gravatt local Westfield Garden City Shopping Precinct and surrounding areas have recently exhibited increased rates of youth crime and anti-social behaviours, citing crimes such as assault, theft, break-and-enter, trespass, robbery and property damage as increasingly common occurrences. The Applicant asserts that the Mt Gravatt region has a proportionally high rate of crime in comparison to the surrounding suburbs of the Gap and Marsden, with 884 offences relative to 170 and 466 respectively</p> <p>This project will target up to 45 youth annually through the Youth Coach Mentoring, ShineGirl and Strength Programs, and 75 youth on a fortnightly basis through the WGC Safe Space program, creating 3,990 engagements in total over the life of the project. The participants will be sourced through referrals from Queensland Police, Westfield, and Youth Justice.</p> <p>The proposed project will be conducted over 28 months and is comprised of eight main activities.</p>
ST VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY QUEENSLAND	Sunshine Beach Community Resilience Project	<p>The St Vincent De Paul Society Queensland is an incorporated not for profit organisation based in South Brisbane, Queensland. The Applicant provides a range of services to people in need including aged care, child and family, disability, disaster relief, drug and alcohol, education and employment, and emergency assistance services.</p> <p>The Applicant asserts that anti-social behaviour and criminal activity by young people in the Noosa Shire is of growing concern with high rates of offences being observed from young people aged 19 and under in the 2020-21 financial year. The Applicant aims to address the issue identified by providing a holistic program that responds to the needs of participants by bringing agencies together, sharing information and giving young people supported options on how to move forward.</p> <p>This project will target up to 106 young people, comprising an annual program of 33 young people aged 12-18 years enrolled at Sunshine Beach High School and 20 young people aged 16-24 years not enrolled in any education, training or employment activity. Referral pathways will be established for the project through a range of channels including the local school, other operations and programs run by the Applicant, families, support organisations and/or government agencies. This project is a continuation of early intervention activities the Applicant currently undertakes.</p>

**Justification for approving grants that were not recommended by the Department**

(a) and 6.2 (b) of the Grant Opportunity Guidelines, the applicant funding amount requested is justified as it demonstrates a clear connection as to how the project will help marginalised youth.</p> <p>Pursuant to Assessment Criteria 6.1. (b), the Applicant has been able to demonstrate an ample response of the extent to which crime and anti-social behaviour is an issue in their community.</p> <p>Pursuant to Assessment Criteria 6.1. (b), the Applicant provided a good explanation for how they will manage the project and its key risks to achieve the outcomes, as well as provision of a clear and comprehensive explanation of their history of delivering early intervention projects, with the letters of support indicating the Applicant's involvement with African youth at high risk in the community.</p> <p>The Assistant Minister is of the opinion that the organisation is a worthy recipient of the funding on the grounds that the youth projects implemented effectively engage youth in early intervention programs to better connect with their community through education, mentoring &amp; leadership. In particular, the organisation conducts successful programs to support young people in the African community both in and after entering youth detention.</p>

### **Ministerial Responsibilities and justification for approving grants that were not recommended by the Department**

#### Ministerial Responsibilities – Commonwealth Financial Management Framework

Agencies are responsible for advising Ministers of the mandatory requirements of the *Commonwealth Grants Rules and Guidelines 2017* (CGRGs) and the broader financial resource management framework.

The CGRGs are issued by the Finance Minister under section 105 of the *Public Governance, Performance and Accountability Act 2013* (PGPA Act) to improve the transparency and accountability of grants administration.

The CGRGs include the following grant-specific decision-making and reporting requirements established by the Australian Government in addition to general requirements arising under the financial management framework where Ministers exercise the role of a financial approver. In accordance with the following paragraphs of the CGRGs:

- Paragraph 4.10a: a Minister must not approve a grant without first receiving written agency advice on the merits of the proposed grant or group of grants. That advice must meet the requirements of the CGRGs.
- Paragraph 4.11a: where a Minister (including a Parliamentary Secretary) approves a proposed grant in his/her own electorate, the Minister must write to the Finance Minister advising of the details.
- Paragraph 4.12(a): the Minister may approve grants that are not recommended by the relevant officials. Ministers (including Senators) must report annually to the Finance Minister on all instances where they have decided to approve a particular grant which the relevant official has recommended be rejected. The report must include a brief statement of reasons (i.e. the basis of the approval for each grant). The report must be provided to the Finance Minister by 31 March each year for the preceding calendar year.
- Paragraph 4.12(b): the Minister must advise the Finance Minister where they have decided to approve a particular grant which the Department has recommended be rejected and this decision relates to the Minister's own electorate.

In addition, the PGPA Act requires that:

- A Minister must not approve a spending proposal unless satisfied, after reasonable inquiries, that giving effect to the spending proposal would be a 'proper use' of relevant money (subsection 71(1) of the PGPA Act). 'Proper' when used in relation to the use or management of public resources means 'efficient, effective, economical and ethical' (PGPA Act, section 8).
- The Minister must record the terms of the approval in writing as soon as practicable after giving the approval (paragraph 71(2)(a) of the PGPA Act) and comply with any other requirements in relation to approvals of the proposed expenditure (paragraph 71(2)(b) of the PGPA Act).
- If the Minister wishes to fund a project which has not been recommended for funding by the Department, the Minister is required to undertake such reasonable inquiries as would enable them to meet the requirements of subsection 71(1) of the PGPA Act as detailed above.

**Justification for approving grants that were not recommended by the Department**

If you do not agree with recommendations in the submission, you must provide appropriate justification as to why you disagree with recommendations from the merit assessment process. If you fund projects against the Department's recommendation, you are required to make reasonable inquiries to determine that the expenditure would be a 'proper use' of relevant money and provide a brief statement of reasons for each project you choose to fund (i.e the basis of your approval). CASEY CITY CHURCH INC	Hope Australia Soccer Academy - Bringing Australians Together	\$1,498,713.00	<p>The Assistant Minister approves of the applicant, Casey City Church Inc., to receive grant funding under the Safer Community Funding Round 6 Early Intervention stream for the following reasons:</p> <p>Pursuant to Assessment Criteria 6.1. (a) and 6.2 (b) of the Grant Opportunity Guidelines, the applicant's funding amount requested is justified as it demonstrates a clear connection as to how the project will help up to 200 marginalised youth in the city of Casey and wider suburbs of Melbourne (Western and South-East Melbourne) across five sites in Keilor Park, Aintree, Narre Warren, Doveton and Cranbourne. The applicant also demonstrates that the project will aid in preventing high risk youth from becoming entrenched in the criminal justice system. The program offered will concentrate on supporting at-risk youth, primarily from refugee and migrant backgrounds, to develop positive behavioural changes through sport (Soccer), mentoring program and youth drop-in centres.</p> <p>Pursuant to Assessment Criteria 6.1. (b), the Applicant has been able to demonstrate an ample response of the extent to which crime and anti-social behaviour is an issue in their community with the Applicant providing evidence from the Crime Statistics Agency and a letter of support from Victorian Police to support the need for the project. The Applicant relied on statistics which indicated an increase in street violence and criminal offences, noting an increase of 2349 to 2442 in Cranbourne, 1090 to 1117 in Cranbourne North and 5484 to 5868 in Dandenong (Crime Statistics Agency).</p>


			<p>Pursuant to Assessment Criteria 6.1. (b), the Applicant provided a clear explanation for how they will manage the project and its key risks to achieve the outcomes, as well as provision of a comprehensive explanation of their history of delivering early intervention projects, with the letters of support evincing the Applicant's involvement with at-risk youth in the community, particularly through the current football program.</p> <p>The Assistant Minister is of the view that, as the applicant conducts a values based, mentoring and sport program with more than 120 youth enrolled, whereby 40% are South Sudanese youth, grant funding for the project has the potential, and historical evidence, to succeed in reducing the risk status of youth and discourage engagement in criminal and anti-social behaviour through improving community and cross-cultural connections.</p> <p>The applicant relied on recent Crime Statistics Agency data which indicate incident rates for assaults, aggravated robberies and aggravated burglaries are far higher for people born in Sudan or South Sudan than other birthplaces. In the past 5 years, the number of aggravated burglaries and robberies carried out by people of South Sudanese background has increased. This data demonstrates not only the need for early intervention against criminal and anti-social behaviour within the South Sudanese youth community but also that the 40% retention rate in the applicant's program targets early intervention needs within this community.</p> <p>The Letters of Support received by the applicant also demonstrate the project's historical success working with disadvantaged youth, the ability to cater for a wide range of issues affecting youth at risk of engaging in criminal and anti-social behaviour and a well-rounded program encompassing Soccer, mentoring programs and youth drop-in centres. As the MUSTER grant funding concluded June 2021, and should no further funding be allocated to the applicant, the project will ultimately end. Casey City Church Inc are currently fundraising to support the program, however, with only skeleton staff and cost cutting occurring each month, running and continuation of the project as it stands in unsustainable. The Assistant Minister seeks to extend the applicant's funding to allow the successful working with 200 marginalised youth in the city of Casey and wider suburbs of Melbourne (Western and South-East Melbourne) to continue.</p>
