Inquiry: Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Amendment (Retaining Federal Approval Powers) Bill 2012

I am writing to voice my objection to the individual states being given powers regarding Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation with relation to mining interests. I believe the Federal Government should retain all powers for the interest of all Australians. I believe that the natural environment needs to be preserved and protected and it is the responsibility of the Australian Federal Parliament to preserve our food and water resources above those of mining interests and the interests of their investors, many who are investing to make a profit on their investment and not to profit the communities affected by the decisions made. It is not a trivial matter and should not be treated that way by the individual states wanting to reap financial and political gain by overriding or bullying local communities or individuals for the benefit of a few.

Please allow the Federal Government to retain approval powers under the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act for the longer term sustainability of our communities and our nation as whole.
