## **Residential Aged Care Inquiry Commences**

The Standing Committee on Health, Aged Care and Sport has commenced an *Inquiry into the Quality* of Care in Residential Aged Care Facilities in Australia.

Over 175 000 Australians live in permanent residential aged care. The Australian Government monitors the quality of care provided to aged care residents through the Australian Aged Care Quality Agency, which accredits and reviews aged care facilities, and the Aged Care Complaints Commissioner, which resolves complaints about government funded services.

The Committee Chair, Mr Trent Zimmerman MP, stated that 'the Committee will be examining Australia's residential aged care system, in particular, the quality of care and services provided to aged care residents. The Committee will also consider the consumer protections available for aged care residents, including those who do not have family members to help them exercise their rights.'

Submissions from interested individuals and organisations are invited by **Thursday, 8 February 2018.** The preferred method of receiving submissions is by electronic format lodged <u>online</u> using a My Parliament account.
