Australian Crime Commission Amendment (Criminology Research) Bill 2015 — Question on Notice

On 19 November 2015, I appeared for the Attorney-General's Department at the Senate Legal and Constitutional Affairs Legislation Committee's public hearing on its inquiry into the above Bill.

Following that hearing, on 23 November 2015 I provided a joint written submission to the Committee from the department, the Australian Crime Commission and the Australian Institute of Criminology.

I am now writing to provide a supplementary answer to a question that I took on notice at the hearing.

The committee asked:

Can [you] provide for the committee, on notice, what statements of expectations have occurred—if any—over the last five years?

Answer: Two Statements of Expectation have been issued to the Australian Institute of Criminology (AIC) over the last five years – one in May 2013 and one in January 2010. The current Statement of Expectation is published on the AIC website.
