Points of Concern regarding Sustainable Diversion Limit (SDL)Adjustment

- 1. If the Murray Darling Basin Authority is given power to adjust SDL's in the future without going through Parliament I believe this would jeopardize the future of farming in Australia.
- 2. We do not believe this authority is capable of acting in a totally independent manner and could be influenced by political pressure to effect change.
- 3. The so-called science used to support the current MDBA plan is an example of how results can be influenced by consultants/organisations that are funded to push certain outcomes.
