Migrant settlement outcomes hearing in Canberra

The <u>Joint Standing Committee on Migration</u> will investigate the effectiveness of Australia's current settlement services at a public hearing tomorrow.

The Committee will be hearing from two refugee advocacy groups the Refugee Council of Australia and the NSW Refugee Communities Advocacy Network as it examines:

- the mix, coordination and extent of settlement services available
- national and international best practice
- whether current migration process adequately assess a prospective migrant's settlement prospects.

The Committee will also discuss the importance of English language ability on a migrant's settlement outcome, school transition support available to students from refugee backgrounds, and access to support services and employment opportunities.
