This was among the first of many vigils held in Sydney and around the country.

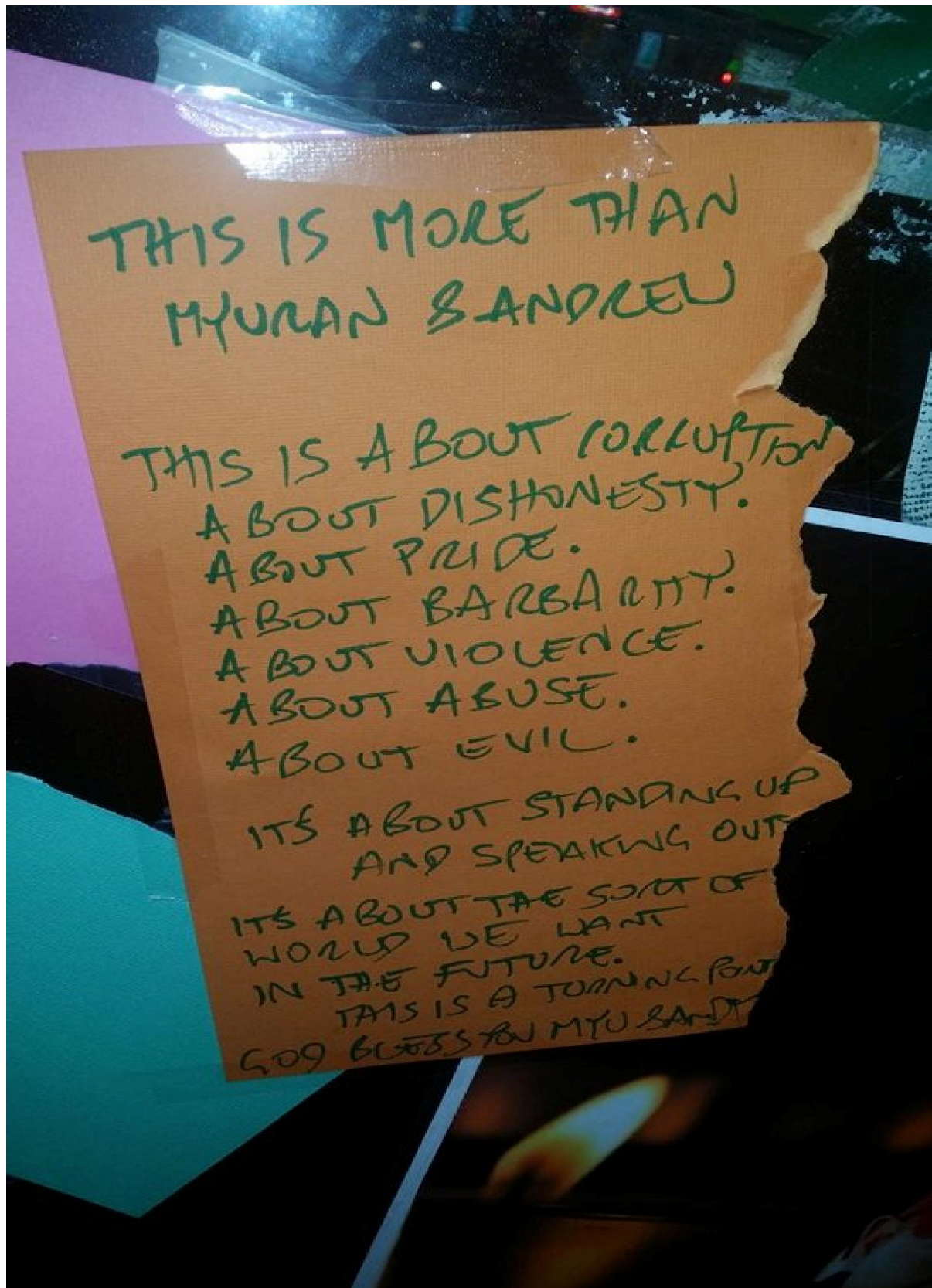

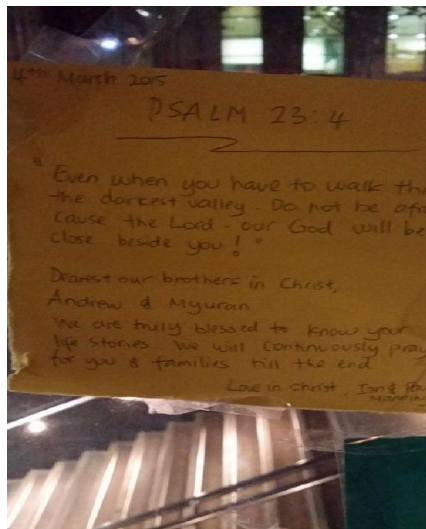
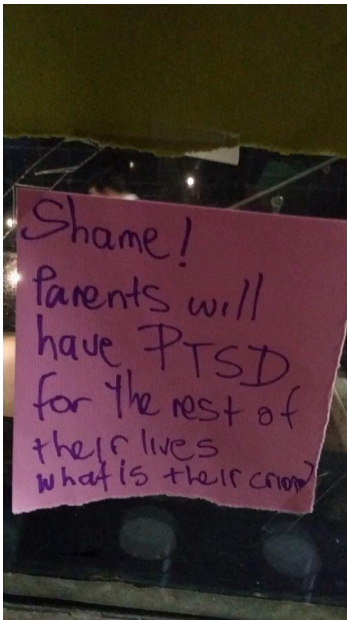
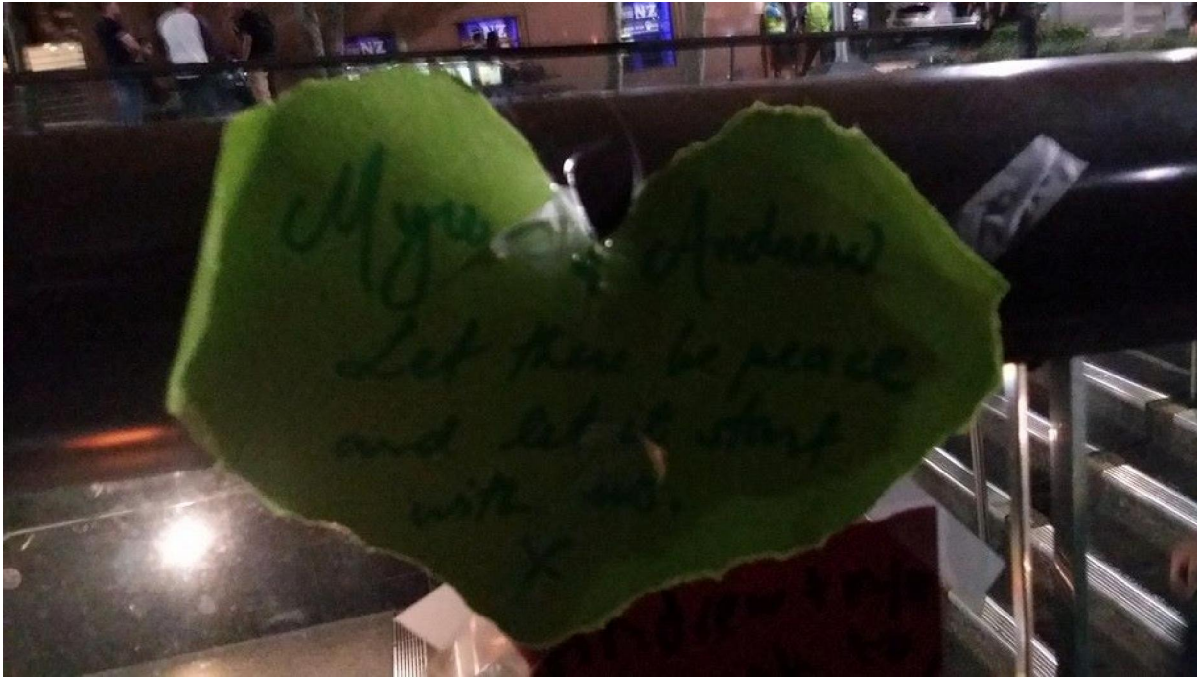




For many days following the vigil, the number of messages increased as people's awareness of, and protest against, the death penalty was felt.
