Light rail inquiry continues

Heritage and planning considerations will be the focus of a public hearing of a parliamentary inquiry into Commonwealth and Parliamentary approvals for the proposed Stage 2 of the ACT light rail project on Thursday 28 June 2018 in Canberra.

The <u>Joint Standing Committee on the National Capital and External Territories</u> will hear from the Department of the Environment and Energy, which is responsible for assessing the environmental and heritage impacts that may result from Stage 2 of the light rail project as it passes through the Parliamentary Zone.

Committee Chair, Mr Ben Morton MP, said that 'the right balance must be struck between meeting territory infrastructure needs and safeguarding the heritage of the Parliamentary zone for all Australians'.

'Thursday's hearing will provide the Committee with an opportunity to better understand the complex environmental and heritage approval processes that are in place to protect the Parliamentary Zone and Parliament House Vista and how these processes will interact with the Stage 2 of the light rail project.'
