The current extreme weather conditions are highlighting the vulnerability of communities in Australia's already harsh landscape. Added to this is the inappropriate siting of Wind Turbine developments throughout the country, which is growing at an alarming rate without taking into consideration the added risks to communities surrounding these wind turbine developments and the inability to fight fires within close proximity to turbine developments and the fact that each turbine is a potential incendiary device, with up to 800 litres of highly flammable gear box oil in the nacelle.
