CHAIR: I appreciate that evidence about last year, and I think you gave some more detailed evidence to a question on notice from, I think, Senator O'Neill, which dealt with some of those issues. Your answer sits comfortably with some of that information. It would be of value to the committee—on notice, of course—for the 2020-21, 2019-20 and 2018-19 years, for you to set out how many full-time APS staff, at the APS levels and the EL levels, and how many non-ongoing and labour hire staff there were in each of those years. I think that would give the committee a reasonable baseline for those three years and would be of assistance. Mr Nelson: Yes, I'll take that on notice.
