I would like to underline my complete *opposition* to windfarms for the following reasons :

- it's a disastrous answer to the real problem of the fossil energies. Its intermittence, its vey low efficiency due to the fact that we are unable to stock the electricity disqualifies it.
- moreover, it has a very strong incidence on the quality of life for the people living in their neighbourhood: the size of the machines, the relating noise, the stroboscopic effects and the permanent flashes transform the previous place of living in an insufferable industrial surrounding. That'really unacceptable.
- it divides the population in two categories: one who gets the money, one who gets the troubles. That's unacceptable.
- it's now fully recognized, that in addition to the troubles mentioned hereabove, the property values will be largely lowered. Who will appreciate to live in such an environment?

It will contribute to the considerable increase of the price of the electricity in a world largely dominated by the international crisis, with very low employment opportunities. Is it really appropriate?

We fight since now several years against this ecologic and financial aberration. We will never stop to fight against this delinquent green ideology.
