## My personal experience of climate change

Over the 70 years of my life I have witnessed a number of effects of a slowly warming climate, including shorter snow seasons in the Australian Alps, shrinking glaciers in New Zealand and the arrival of grey headed flying foxes in urban Canberra. I have noted news reports of beach-side houses being undermined by rising sea levels.

## My understanding of climate change

I accept the scientific studies that say that climate change is induced by humans, irreversible, but can be mitigated. I accept the report of the recent Bushfire Royal Commission that the 2019/2020 fires were made worse by climate change.

## What I would like the Australian government to do

- Commit to an emissions reduction target. A legislated target will drive climate change mitigation through successive governments. A net target of zero by 2050, with 5 yearly interim targets, should be the minimum target
- Phase out all subsidies and infrastructure support for high-emission sources of energy such as
  coal and gas; provide financial incentives for low-emission sources of energy such as wind and
  solar; fund improvements in storage and distribution of energy so that wind and solar energy
  can provide reliability; stop the Adani project
- Support the export of low-emission energy to other countries; investigate supply of energy by cable to Indonesia
- Assist people displaced from employment by reduced production of high-emission energy fuels
- Increase protection of national parks and reserves, recognizing their function as carbon sinks and as refuges for threatened species being affected by climate change; save the corroboree frog
- Establish an Independent Climate Change Commission. Whichever political party you currently
  support, think of a Climate Change Commission as a way of ensuring sanity and science prevail
  during the period when the parties that you do not support will be in power. Dealing with
  climate change is a decades-long project; Australia people, businesses and farmers will suffer if
  government policy on climate action changes every four years.
