On returning to Australia I was appointed director and secretary on 23rd December 2010 and my father resigned.

MY RESIGNATION:

The emotional strain that I have endured in the last six months as a result of threats from the CFMEU and other belligerent and lying subcontractors has caused me to become totally disillusioned with the building industry to the extent that I considered on completion of current projects closing down the company. After discussions with my father it was agreed that I resign and he would accept the position as director and changed the company's name in an effort to maintain the goodwill that had been established with subcontractors and clients
