**QIFVLS Response:** QIFVLS has not received any additional information regarding a transition from compulsory income management to voluntary income management other than the information we received via the bill and explanatory memorandum.

2. Should the Bill be withdrawn? (Senator Thorpe)

**QIFVLS Response:** QIFVLS believes that rather than withdrawing the Bill, the government should take greater steps to consult widely and enhance the current Bill. Consultations should take into considerations the diversity amongst Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.
