## Dear Committee Secretary,

This letter is to provide corrections to information provided at the ATO's appearance before the Senate Legal and Constitutional Affairs Committee on 7 December 2016. I refer to information provided on pages 2, 5, 13 and 18 of the Hansard.

1. In response to a question asked by Senator Dodson asking who we advised that we were undertaking actions, I (Andrew Mills) stated "we advised the current minister and the Treasurer as well as the Attorney-General of actions". I would like to note a correction for the record. I should have stated we advised the offices of the current minister, Treasurer and Attorney-General.
2. In response to questions asked regarding when the first written advice or minute provided, I (Andrew Mills) advised that it was 5 June. I would like to note a correction for the record. The first briefing I have identified was on 10 June.
3. In response to questions asked by Senator McKim on a briefing note provided to Senator Cormann's office, I (Robert Puckridge) stated that it was "my recollection is that it was purely for information and it was not addressed to the senator; it was addressed to his office". I would like to note a correction for the record. The Minute was addressed to the Minister of Finance.
4. In response to "do you want to add anything to that" asked by Senator Xenaphon, I (Robert Puckridge) stated "the commissioner had now decided that he would intervene in his own right and would not await intervention by the Attorney-General". I would like to clarify this statement for the record. I was referring to intervention in the High Court litigation, rather than any intervention in the Commissioner’s decision to intervene.
