Question: Can you take on notice who was consulted in the development of the framework that you were talking about?

This question was asked by Senator Siewert to the Department of Health during the Senate Community Affairs References Committee hearing on the My Health Record system, held on Monday 17 September 2018.

Ms Caroline Edwards, Deputy Secretary, Health Systems Policy and Primary Care, Department of Health, agreed to take this question on notice.

Answer:

Over a six-week period, from 5 October to 17 November 2017, community consultations to inform the development of the *Framework to guide the secondary use of My Health Record system data* (the Framework) were undertaken. 794 individuals participated in various consultation fora, including:

- 13 workshops across each state and territory (256)
- 2 webinars (159)
- online Survey (274)
- 14 interviews (25); and
- written submissions (80).

Of the 80 written submissions received, 63 agreed that the submission be published.
