Number of COVID-19 cases and deaths reported in Australia each day

Question:

Could you please provide the following data in a spreadsheet, with the data broken down by jurisdiction (state or territory):

- (a) the number of COVID-19 cases in Australia reported each day, starting from the date of the first case in Australia; and
- (b) the number of COVID-19 deaths in Australia reported each day, starting from the date of the first death in Australia.

Answer:

The number of COVID-19 cases is available on the Department of Health website at: (<https://www.health.gov.au/news/health-alerts/novel-coronavirus-2019-ncov-health-alert/coronavirus-covid-19-current-situation-and-case-numbers>) which provides a breakdown of cases from January to the current date.

There is no publicly available tabular data for the number of cases or deaths reported by day on the Department's website, however there is analysis of this data in the CDI reports published fortnightly available at:
