Law Enforcement Committee examines the theft and export of motor vehicles

On 28 March 2018, the Parliamentary Joint Committee on Law Enforcement commenced a new inquiry into the theft and export of motor vehicles and parts.

In 2016, motor vehicle thefts increased by 9 per cent, driven entirely by increases in motor vehicle thefts in Victoria, Queensland and South Australia.¹ According to the National Motor Vehicle Theft Reduction Council, stolen vehicles exported as a whole, parts or scrap account for 4 in 10 profit-motivated thefts.² This trend is rising.³

The committee will consider the extent of and trends in theft and trafficking of motor vehicles and parts, including:

- rates of motor vehicle theft and recovery in Australia in comparison with other OECD • nations;
- the insurance implications of motor vehicle theft; •
- the adequacy of Australian export regulations;
- the role and involvement of serious and organised criminal groups; •
- the use of Australian banking and financial systems to facilitate the export of stolen motor • vehicles and parts; and
- strategies to reduce motor vehicle theft in Australia, including the use of new technologies.

The committee invites submissions addressing the terms of reference from interested individuals and organisations by 17 May 2018.
