In particular I have been involved in a broad range of activities associated with Not-for-Profits. I have worked on Boards in both fund raising, funds delivery and administration in large and small bodies. Over that time I have observed the growth and operations of large and small charities, the rapid increase in the sector in the 90s and 00s. Prior to that I was an observer of the idiosyncratic nature of the old system and saw close up some of the rorts of the then system.

To introduce a Bill with a vague and totally unspecified means of replacing these functions is the act of a government covering up its intentions and also should be deplored.
