

To the Secretary,



The Presbyterian Women's Association represents women from all walks of like across New South Wales. The State Council consists of 51 elected representatives from city and country and meets monthly to discuss a range of matters.

We are concerned for the welfare of women and the community, but the plight of women in some cultures is now happening in Australia. It is therefore a welcome development for this Bill to attempt to deal with some of the abuses which have become evident in recent times.

The plight of some girls forced into marriage is pitiful and difficult to assist at the present time. The provisions in this Bill for action to be taken at Law will strengthen the ability of our police and welfare workers to assist those young women who come to the Community Groups or individuals for help in cases of sexual abuse or forced marriage. Immigrant children educated in Australian schools will expect more of life. Families should be given instructions in their own language when they arrive so that they will understand that this custom is against the Law in Australia and there are serious consequences.

The broader definitions of exploitation, forced labour and slavery and the inclusion of psychological oppression and abuse of power are important. Victims of trafficking will be better protected.

We commend this important Bill and encourage the Committee to approve it so that it may go to the Government and soon become Law.
