We do not wish to make any corrections to the transcript.

In relation to questions on notice, there is only one, as follows:

**Senator O'NEILL:** Has AUSTRAC made you aware of their concerns? The figure that's cited most commonly is \$47 billion to \$50 billion per annum.

**Ms McPhee:** I'm not aware of conversations that have taken place, but there could well be. We do obviously collaborate and have discussions about various aspects that involve both of our briefs.

**Senator O'NEILL:** Could you take on notice to inquire into those meetings with AUSTRAC where tranche 2 or the concerns about the level of money laundering and impact on Australian financial structures have come up.

Ms McPhee: Yes, definitely.

We have inquired into this and our answer is that there have not been any meetings between the RBA and AUSTRAC where the matters raised by Senator O'Neill have come up.
