Second public hearing for inquiry into support for Australia's thalidomide survivors

The Senate Community Affairs References Committee is holding a public hearing for its inquiry into support for Australia's thalidomide survivors tomorrow, 31 January 2019. The hearing will be in Sydney, in the Macquarie Room of the NSW Parliament, from 8.30am – 5.00pm.

'The committee has invited thalidomide survivors and other witnesses to give evidence at the hearing so that the committee can hear first-hand of the lived-experiences and support requirements of survivors. The committee has already received evidence describing the significant daily challenges faced by thalidomide survivors and how their support requirements are likely to change in the future,' said the Committee's Chair, Senator Rachel Siewert.

'The hearing will provide an opportunity for witnesses to share the life experiences of thalidomide survivors with the committee and outline the solutions needed to best meet survivors' support requirements.' Senator Siewert said.

The committee welcomes submissions from anyone with knowledge regarding the health outcomes and support requirements of Australia's thalidomide survivors. 'While the formal date for submissions has passed, the committee will consider submissions from individuals or organisations who may be able to provide information relevant to the inquiry', Senator Siewert said.
