This procedural instruction will be updated in the coming weeks to reflect changes made on 27 February 2021, including the name change from Distinguished Talent visa (subclass 858) to Global Talent visa, and the introduction of a pathway for persons endorsed by the Prime Minister's Special Envoy for Global Business and Talent Attraction.
