I fully support the Social Services Legislation Amendment (Cashless Debit Card Trial Expansion Bill 2018).

I have read the report where Ceduna Mayor Allan Smith commented that this is the best thing we have ever had. when reporting on the effects of the trial in Ceduna where Grocery sales are up and alcohol sales are down. Domestic violence, alcoholism, school truancy and ambulance call-outs are all reduced. Also it is reported that more people are seeking financial counselling.

I was born in Australia and over many years I have seen our young people increasingly unemployed and drifting toward tobacco abuse, gambling and alcohol abuse and the subsequent despair and downward spiral into mental health problems.
