



Public hearing on making ABSTUDY work for Indigenous students

The Standing Committee on Indigenous Affairs is inquiring into what educational options have met with the most success for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. As part of the inquiry, communities have raised a number of concerns regarding the administration, delivery and eligibility criteria of ABSTUDY.

The Committee will hear from representatives of the Department of Social Services, Human Services, and Prime Minister and Cabinet at a special public hearing scheduled for today.

The Committee will also hear from the STARS foundation which provides leadership programs for Indigenous girls in the Northern Territory.
