



Public hearing into Sir John Monash Centre, Australian National Memorial, Villers-Bretonneux, France

The Public Works Committee is conducting a public hearing into the proposed construction of the Sir John Monash Centre (SJMC) to be located adjacent to the Australian National Memorial in Villers-Bretonneux, France.

The Department of Veterans' Affairs has told the Committee that the building will be partially concealed under the landscape in order to remain respectful of the site's existing cemetery and memorial and the surrounding battlefields.

The SJMC will complement the Australian Remembrance Trail, the Australian National Memorial and the Franco-Australian Museum in Villers-Bretonneux, all of which commemorate Australia's service along the Western Front during the First World War. The design will offer visitors an interpretive experience not found elsewhere on the Western Front.

Construction and fit-out of the SJMC is expected to be completed in February 2018 in time for the centenary of the Battle of Villers-Bretonneux in April 2018. The estimated cost of the project is \$93.2 million.
