## Re: The Australian Manufacturing Industry-Submission

I am an Australian Patriot who wishes to see Australia become economically great again as it was for 20 years after the second world War.

To address "c. the drivers of growth in manufacturing in Australia and around the world" the answer is to create a National development bank which creates credit to lend to manufacturers at very low interest (less than 1%) and build infrastructure. The infrastructure would be "The Bradfield Scheme", "The iron Boomerang", "The Clarance River scheme", complete "the Ord River Irrigation Scheme". Because this is a bank it would be no cost to Tax payers as the banks credit is separate from taxation income levied by the government. These national development schemes make the cost of operating a business much cheaper.

In addressing "h. the opportunity for reliable, cheap, renewable energy to keep Australia's manufactured exports competitive in a carbon-constrained global economy and the role that our manufacturing industry can play in delivering the reliable, cheap, renewable energy that is needed."
