The Australian Automobile Association (AAA) thanks the Joint Select Committee on Road Safety for Question on Notice RSQN014 requesting further information on pre-learner road safety education delivered by Australia's motoring clubs.

The AAA has gathered this information from each club and a table is provided in the attached document that outlines their activities, the student reach in each state and the club partnerships in resourcing and delivering the programs.

The clubs' activities can be summarised as follows:

- The combined national reach of club-delivered road safety education to prelearner students is approximately 255,900 students per year
- Club education staff engage with students ranging from kindergarten through to university/college
- Education programs include classroom, online, event-based and in-vehicle activities
- Education activities are a mix of wholly club resourced, both staffing and financial, and partnership funding arrangements.
