Public hearings on key foreign interference bills

The Parliamentary Joint Committee on Intelligence and Security will hold two days of public hearings this week for its review of two important bills targeting espionage and foreign interference:

- the National Security Legislation Amendment (Espionage and Foreign Interference) Bill 2017, which
 amends existing criminal laws for secrecy and espionage offences, and introduces new foreign
 interference and sabotage offences, and
- the Foreign Influence Transparency Scheme Bill 2017, which establishes a scheme that requires
 registration by persons who undertake certain activities within Australia on behalf of foreign
 interests.

The Chair of the Committee, Mr Andrew Hastie MP, said that "Espionage and foreign interference in Australia has been described by ASIO as 'extensive, unrelenting and increasingly sophisticated'. The proposed new laws are aimed at addressing gaps in current laws to enable authorities to more effectively respond to this threat.

"The Committee's review will be aimed at ensuring the new laws are as effective as possible, and balanced with appropriate safeguards and oversight mechanisms."
