#### **Ouestion:**

Senator ALLMAN-PAYNE: You're not certain, though, that it wasn't applied before then. Back to my original question—in the advice that you gave to the minister, was that the only time period or were there a range of options put to the minister about the time period that the waiver could cover?

Mr Flavel: As you know, the normal convention is not to talk about particular elements of advice. I've already said we've provided a range of advice to the minister. If you want to go to specifics about when and where, I'll take that on notice.

Senator ALLMAN-PAYNE: Yes, if you could take that on notice it would be really appreciated.

Mr Flavel: Sure.

#### Answer:

The Department has provided a range of advice to the Minister on options for resolving income apportionment.

Changes to social security law were made in September 2003. It is now understood, from this date income apportionment was unlawful for most payment types.
