## Inquiry into recent ABC programming decisions

## **Terms of Reference**

That the following matter be referred to the Environment and Communications References Committee for inquiry and report by 12 October 2011:

The decision by the television management of the Australian Broadcasting Corporation (ABC) to significantly cut the number and amount of ABC-produced programs, jobs (including through forced redundancies) and potentially affect resources, as announced on 2 August 2011, with particular reference to:

(a) the implications of this decision on the ABC's ability to create, produce and own its television content, particularly in the capital cities of Brisbane, Adelaide, Perth and Hobart;

(b) the implications of this decision on Australian film and television production in general and potential impact on quality and diversity of programs;

Out of respect for the late Andrea Stretton who presented the ABC's Sunday afternoon arts show I would stress the importance of the integrity of Andrea's presentation. Clearly, there are new ABC interviewers who could also contribute to diverse programs.

Recommendation: That the ABC does not cut jobs but finds new programs where interviewers can display the skills that we grew to respect from Andrea Stretton. There are a number of male and female presenters currently working for the ABC channels who could continue the tradition.

(c) whether a reduction in ABC-produced programs is contrary to the aims of the National Regional Program Initiative;

(d) the implications of these cuts on content ownership and intellectual property;

 (e) the impact of the ABC's decision to end internal production of Bananas in Pyjamas and to outsource the making of a 'Bananas in Pyjamas' animation series to Southern Star Endemol Proprietary Limited;

'Bananas in Pyjamas' belongs with the ABC and has helped young presenters and actors start their careers not to mention the interest created for a vast audience of Australian children.

Recommendation: That this program continues to be produced internally and is not outsourced.

Dramas that could be sourced from Australian writers and produced internally need to be continued. A past example would be 'Seachange'.
