Has ASIC seen any changes in the registration of companies on the registers it operates - increases, decreases in types of companies across March-June 2020?

Answer

We refer to the information contained in the answer to questions 001-01, we extract the relevant information in respect to this question below.

In the first six months of 2019, 113,205 new companies were registered compared to a slight decrease to 110,246 in the first six months of 2020.

New company registrations were up 7% in January and February, but were down from March to May, with the largest drop being 20% in April and the lowest monthly volume since January 2013. Volumes recovered in June, being 8% higher than June 2019.

There has been no discernible change in the breakdown of the types of companies registered. Proprietary companies continue to make up the vast majority of new registrations, with 99.3% compared to 0.7% for public companies for January to June 2020. The proportion of proprietary and public companies was identical for the same period in 2019.

It also worth to noting that in May and June 2020, a record number of new business name registrations (over 43,000 in June) were completed.
