What scares me most about climate change (the climate change I have experienced in the latter part of my 67 years) is the impact on food supplies. We can see the droughts throughout the world, and the floods - both occurring more often and with greater intensity than at any other time since the industrial revolution*. We can see the impact on crops and livestock. But many people seem blithely unaware of the impact on fish stocks of the warming ocean, and the greater acidity of oceans.

World population steadily increases, but food supplies will dwindle over time. What happens then!? War over scarce resources, and invasion of those countries with food resources still available.

And isn't it time to talk about controlling population?
