Public hearings into Canberra's national institutions

The <u>Federal Parliamentary Committee</u> examining Canberra's national institutions will continue its public hearing program in Canberra on Friday.

The Committee will be hearing evidence from a number of stakeholders, with an emphasis on the role national institutions play in engaging students.

The Chair of the Committee, Mr Ben Morton MP, said "annually more than 162,000 school aged children from all over Australia travel to Canberra to our national institutions and learn about civics, citizenship, democracy, history, science and the arts."

"Friday's public hearing will provide the Committee with an opportunity to consider how to further strengthen such an important part of the education experience for Australian children and other visitors to the nation's capital," Mr Morton said.
