### **Social Inclusion Programs**

**Senator BILYK**

**Question:**

Are there any community grant programs available to training providers to encourage inclusion?

**Answer:**

The central strategy of the Diverse Australia Program is to respond to issues of racism and intolerance and promote opportunities for people to participate in Australian life.

The Program provides funds for not-for-profit organisations to develop their own projects that encourage inclusion and mutual respect. Incorporated not for profit training providers are able to apply for Diverse Australia Program funding.

### **Student Visa Application Charge**

**Question:**

What services are covered by the Student Visa Application Charge?

**Answer:**

The levels of Visa Application Charges (VACs) are determined by Government and take into account a number of factors, including the cost of immigration border control and compliance activities. Consistent with the user pays principle, the Government has determined that these costs should be largely borne by the users of these services and not be borne by the Australian taxpayer at large.

During the 2009-10 budget process, DIAC in conjunction with the Expenditure Review Taskforce exercise run by the Department of Finance and Deregulation reviewed all VACs. After considering the information gathered in the review, including information on the relative level of visa fees in other countries, various options were put to the Government for consideration in the 2009-10 Federal Budget. The Government decided to increase a range of VACs at a rate higher than the normal CPI adjustment to reflect the increase in border control and migration activities costs over recent years. The Student VAC increased from \$450 to \$540.
