Countering violent extremism discussed at public hearing

Representatives of the Attorney General's Department will discuss countering violent extremism when the <u>Joint Standing Committee on Migration</u> holds a public hearing as part of its inquiry into Migrant Settlement Outcomes.

Committee Chair Jason Wood MP said, "for a range of reasons, young people from migrant and refugee backgrounds are particularly vulnerable and there is the potential that they could be exploited by terrorist recruiters."

"It is important that Australia puts mechanisms in place to remove opportunities from radicalising to violent extremism and prevent individuals from engaging in or supporting terrorism in Australia or overseas."
