The House of Representatives Standing Committee on Economics will scrutinise the Australian Prudential Regulation Authority (APRA), as part of its review of the performance and operation of Australia's financial, banking and insurance regulator.

The Chair of the committee, Ms Sarah Henderson MP, said 'the hearing will provide the Committee with the opportunity to question APRA on its performance and operation, including measures to reinforce sound lending practices and ensure that Australian banks remain prudentially strong.'

'Other areas of interest for the committee include APRA's prudential inquiry into the Commonwealth Bank of Australia, the new Banking Executive Accountability Regime (BEAR), and measures to strengthen the Australian superannuation system, particularly improving fund performance and outcomes for members', Ms Henderson said.

APRA is the prudential regulator of Australia's financial services industry. It oversees banks, credit unions, building societies, general insurance and reinsurance companies, life insurance, private health insurance, friendly societies, and most of the superannuation industry.
